

FINDING APPRENTICESHIP VACANCIES

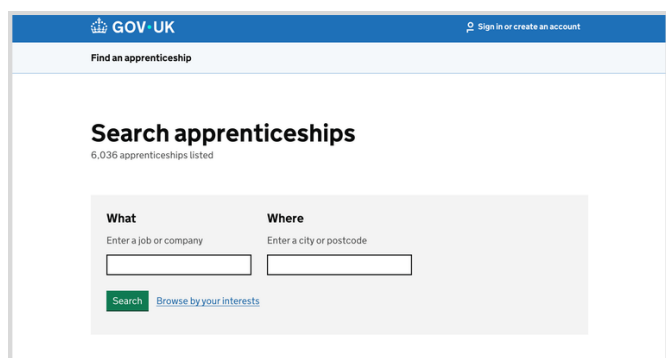
There are lots of ways you can search for apprenticeships

Apprenticeships are advertised throughout the year, on different websites and platforms. There are many ways you can search for apprenticeship vacancies, set out in this short guide.

Find an apprenticeship

Find an apprenticeship is the Government apprenticeship vacancy portal, providing free access to a large number of apprenticeship vacancies from across England at all levels. Anyone aged over 14 can create an account on this secure platform, enabling you to set up alerts for when new jobs are added that you might be interested in.

Company websites

Most employers will add new apprenticeship vacancies to their company website. Search in the 'careers' section of the site to find information about current vacancies, and potentially future opportunities too.

Many employers will offer a signup service to keep you informed as soon as new positions are open, and others may advertise when the next recruitment window will be, so you know when to check back. Application processes and timelines will vary between different employers.



When should you start applying?

Some employers could start recruiting as early as one year before they want the apprentice to start, others will have a shorter recruitment window. Employers will recruit apprentices at different times of the year and there is no set time or deadline to apply for apprenticeships like there is for university applications.

Look out for other ways to stay connected to employers and take advantage of the different ways you could learn more about their organisation through virtual work experience, open days and webinars.

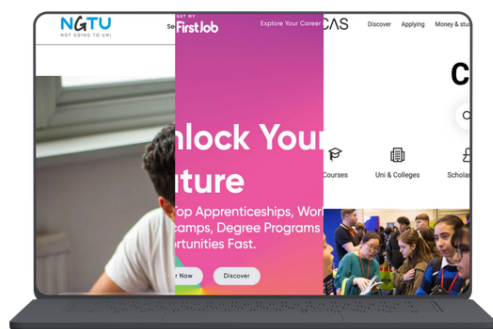

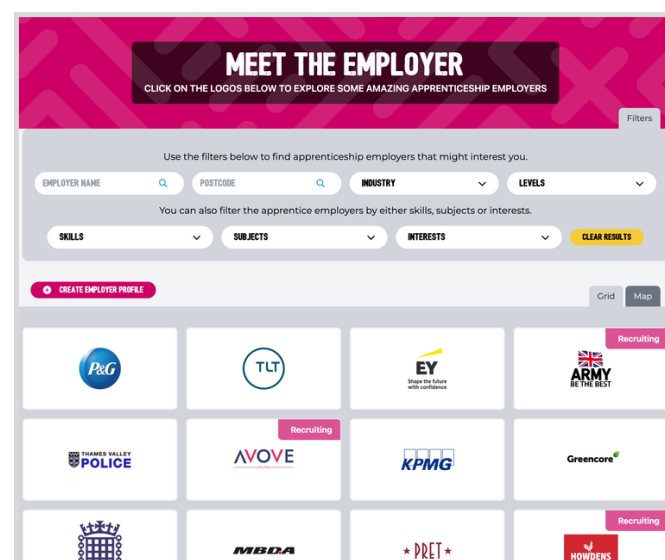
Training providers
